

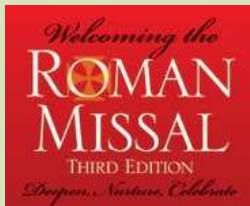

## YOUNG ADULT AND CAMPUS MINISTRY

**Third Edition of the Roman Missal Approved:  
What Does this Mean for You?**



The *Roman Missal, Third Edition*, the ritual text containing prayers and instructions for the celebration of the Mass, has been approved by the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments. **First use of the new text of the new Roman Missal will be on the First Sunday of Advent, November 27, 2011** (<http://www.nccbuscc.org/romanmissal/>).

How does this affect you as a young adult? We attempted to help you with this question by offering a 3-part Theology on Tap Session. On Thursday, October 21st, young adults gathered at Columbia Street West for the second session of this series. Brian MacMichael, Director of the Office of Worship, explained how these translations will usher in an even greater wonder and awe in the Mass. These changes, based on the original Latin translation, will have a more literal, rich and poetic feel to them and will draw people into a richer and more profound experience of the Mass.

The process began back in 1997 at the request of Pope John Paul II. A great deal of time and effort took place on the part of many, including the International Commission on English in the Liturgy, as well as a special committee of bishops.

Brian offered examples of some of these changes and how the congregation will reply differently. He said it will take a little time for people to get the hang of it, but once they do, they should be able to recognize more fully in the language, the great beauty of the Mass and the mystery that takes place. He also mentioned that as a congregation we have to be patient with and encourage our priests because the changes they will be making are much greater than ours.

After Brian's talk, we spoke to Scott Gillis, a young adult from St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish. He shared that he believes the changes for him will bring a new sense of devotion and appreciation for the Mass.

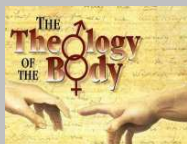

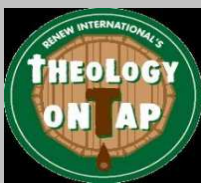
